Directions

1. When printing, make sure to print on **BOTH** sides and select “FLIP ON SHORT END” to create the booklet.
2. Introduce the Bill of Rights booklet to the students and explain how the Bill of Rights was added to the Constitution to help focus on the protection of the citizens.
3. Each page has how that specific amendment helps protect the citizens.
4. Students may be able to draw a picture of the amendment OR they can write the key word for the amendment in the blank space.

1st Amendment

What does it protect?

The first amendment
protects our freedom
of speech, freedom
of press, freedom of
assembly and to
protest.

10th Amendment

What does it protect?

The tenth amendment
provides each state
with powers that are
not assigned to the
nation's government.

9th Amendment

What does it protect?

The ninth amendment
states that people
still have all the
rights that are not
listed.

2nd Amendment

What does it protect?

The second
amendment protects
our right to bear
arms

3rd Amendment

The third amendment
prevents the
government from
placing troops in our
homes.

8th Amendment

The eighth amendment
protects from high
bail, high fines, and
cruel and unusual
punishments.

trial by jury in civil
